
Focusing mainly on Nagano Prefecture Regional Map



Matsumoto Castle (Matsumoto City) Built in the 16th century. Matsumoto Castle is Japan's oldest castle and has been designated a National Treasure. Climb the stairs to the top for a striking panoramic view of Matsumoto and the surrounding Japan Alps.
